Concordia University Wisconsin Kammerchor to perform in Chesterland

Mentor High School graduate Hannah Ryan (Class of 2020) will be returning to the Cleveland area to perform with the Concordia University Wisconsin Kammerchor.

Mequon, WI – Kammerchor, Concordia University Wisconsin's select touring choir, will be singing a concert at St. Mark Lutheran Church in Chesterland, Ohio, on Wednesday, March 15, at 7:30 pm as part of their 2023 spring tour. St. Mark Lutheran Church is located at 11900 Chillicothe Road. Admission is free, but a freewill offering will be collected.

The choir will be singing a program consisting primarily of unaccompanied choral pieces in a variety of musical styles from the 1500s to the present. Entitled "His Wondrous Love," the concert will include selections by William Byrd, Johannes Brahms, Randall Thompson, and Ralph Vaughan Williams, as well as others.

Kammerchor (German for "chamber choir") was founded by Dr. Kenneth T. Kosche as a small vocal group selected from concurrent membership in the Concordia Chorale. In 1981 it became established as Concordia's touring choir, and the Concordia Chorale became the chapel choir. Tours subsequently have taken Kammerchor virtually all over the continental USA, several times to Canada, and overseas to locations as varied as Brazil, Great Britain, China, Italy, the Czech Republic, and Slovakia. Kammerchor has provided recorded music for broadcasts of *The Lutheran Hour*, the radio ministry of the International Lutheran Laymen's League, and for *Worship for Shut-Ins*. Membership in Kammerchor is not limited to music majors, but includes students with a range of majors and minors. Kammerchor sings a wide variety of choral literature from the Renaissance to the present, including concert pieces, anthems, spirituals, and hymns.

Dr. Alexa Doebele, conductor, is professor of music at Concordia University Wisconsin, where she conducts Kammerchor, Selah, and the Chapel Choir, as well as teaches courses in music education and parish music. She has taught previously at the University of Wyoming, the University of Colorado, and Front Range Community College. She is a frequent clinician, adjudicator, and guest conductor, and is active as an editor of choral music. She is also active as both a solo and choral singer, having appeared with the Milwaukee Chamber Choir, Vox Antiqua, Milwaukee Choral Artists, the Colorado Conductors' Chorus, the Ars Nova Singers, and St. Martin's Chamber Choir.


Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

They will receive a schedule of them at the end of the March 19 class and can decide later whether to return for the other classes. The class will be held in the Matthew Room from 9 a.m. sharp until 10 a.m. It's best to enter the back entrance of the church, step into the hallway, and take the first classroom on your left. There will be signs. Feel free to come with your guest for this special class. There will be a nice gift for non-members who attend. We are doing Easter baskets again this year for the foster children of Geauga County through Job and Family Services and the children at WomenSafe.

For those of you that are new to this mission or for those who need clarification we have Easter baskets in the narthex of the church. **Janie Palmer** and **Monica McGurer** put these baskets together for you to take home with you and fill. In the basket there is grass, bow, cellophane bag, stuffed animal and a tag. On the tag is girl/boy and age groups. This year we would also like some gender/age neutral baskets for WomenSafe.

WomenSafe is a bit of a challenge for us because the children come and go. So we never know for sure how many children there will be, age or gender. The children we like to focus on are the younger ones age 1 to about 10 years old. This is why we would like some gender neutral baskets.

We will be delivering the baskets for Job and Family Services the week of March 19, so we will need the baskets returned to the church no later than March 19.

Suggestions for gender neutral baskets would be: Gift cards to McDonald's, Wendy's etc.; candy; puzzles; games small enough to fit in a basket; books; coloring book and crayons or markers; water color paints; stuffed animals (which we supply); yo-yo; jump rope; sand toys.

For Job and Family Services we usually deliver around 100 baskets. You can choose to do a theme – for instance, baseball, and make up a basket with baseball cards, baseball hat, a ball, a book about baseball etc. You can make up any theme you want or just do a general basket.

Suggestions for Job and Family Services are the same as the list above with some other additional suggestions: toy truck or car; doll; nail polish and/or manicure items for teen girls; balls (baseball, soccer ball, football, basketball); squirt gun; card games; T shirts; flip flops; food baskets for teenage boys (small bags of chips, cheese crackers, little smokies, pretzels, etc.).

Be as creative as you want. Last year we had someone that bought a child size outdoor chair and filled the basket with outdoor toys. Have fun filling your basket/ baskets.

As always you can give donations to Monica and she will put a basket together for you. There is no minimum dollar amount, it's whatever you feel comfortable spending.

If you have any questions Monica attends the 10:15 a.m. service. You can talk to her before or after the service, call her at home or email her. You can also put any monetary donation in her mailbox at the church.

Let Your Shopping Help St. Mark




About the Plant Sale: Do we want to hold a Plant Sale again this year?

To those who are new members: we offer a Plant Sale in May comprised of hanging baskets, veggies, 4 inch pots and flats of 24 or 36 annuals. Older members need to know that participation has dropped considerably. For example, we only sold 60 hanging baskets last year compared to 110-120 in past years.

We use Urban Growers who are very well known around the area and very, very fair on their prices to us. Our prices are very competitive to nursery prices. Yes. Marc's and Walmart have cheaper prices but they definitely aren't the quality of nursery plants.

Those of us who work the plant sale truly enjoy it but we feel we need the support of the church members if we are going to continue.
